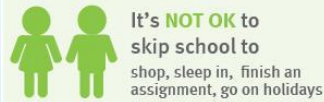

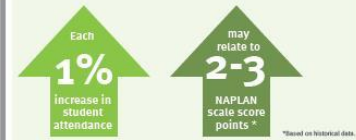

I would also like to take a moment to acknowledge the outstanding way our students conducted themselves during our recent **ANZAC ceremony**. They demonstrated respect, maturity, and a deep understanding of the significance of the occasion. We are very proud of the way they represented our school and honoured this important event.



Our **Senior Student Councillors** will be meeting this week to begin planning their activities for the term. It is always encouraging to see our student leaders taking initiative and contributing ideas to enhance school life. One exciting suggestion from our senior students is to hold a **Pet Parade on Friday 22 May**, which will coincide with our **Under 8's Morning**.
